Born on **27 February 1978 in Kouroussa**, Republic of Guinea, Ambassador Diallo is a seasoned representative with extensive expertise in diplomacy, international relations, and multilateral engagements.

On 2nd March 2023, Ambassador Diallo was received at the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) for his working copies and later presented his credentials to His Majesty King Charles III on 15 March 2023 at St. James's Court in London. He also currently serves as the Permanent Representative of the Republic of Guinea to the International Maritime Organization (IMO). He is accredited in Ireland and Islande.

Ambassador Diallo graduated from the Faculty of Social Sciences and Arts at Kankan University (English Department) in Guinea, where he studied from **2001** to **2004**. This solid academic foundation in English and social sciences laid the groundwork for his international diplomatic career.

2009 : Ambassador Aly participated in a third advanced diplomatic practices training program for young African diplomats at the Federal Diplomatic Academy in **Berlin** (**Germany**), at the European Union Commission as well as **NATO headquarter** in **Brussels (Belgium)**.
